When we warehouse our seniors in wards it is impossible to contain the spread of colds and influenza - let alone a pandemic.

Two things need to change in order to transform senior care:

- We need to move towards residential models of care
- The funding needs to follow the resident

As COVID-19 Ravages Nursing Homes, A New Push For

Better Senior Housing

There have been 10,000 deaths and 50,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 among residents and staff at long-term care facilities as of last week,

according to the Kaiser Family Foundation, a national public health organization . In

some states, nursing home residents account for more than half of COVID-19 deaths. Thosealarming numbers have intensified an important discussion the nation will wrestle with for years to come: How can the United States expand community-based alternatives for seniors and improve care in larger facilities?

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Our COVID-19 Response

With the rapidly changing situation regarding COVID-19, over the last few months we know that many there has been concern about seniors in Long Term Care and Congregated Living Sites. We are pleased that our residents and staff have remained safe and well.

We acted quickly in mid March and closed our homes to all but essential staff (before this was mandated by the Alberta Government). We also prohibited our staff from working at other long term care homes or medical facilities; prior to the Government mandate.

We have hired more staff and are prepared to continue providing loving care to our residents should we have any staff that must be off work due to illness or self isolation. The safety of our residents and staff has been and continues to be our highest priority.

We continue to have staff complete a Government mandated wellness check and temperature reading upon arrival for their shifts. This is logged and saved.

As mandated by the Alberta Government; our staff now wears masks during their shift for the protection of your loved ones.

Residents are now enjoying Physically Distanced outside visits with family.

It has been and continues to be a difficult time for everyone but we are proud to be able to be here for our elders and provide them with love and care. We also have been engaging the residents in many fun activities in our homes! See some pictures below!
